Have you ever had a bad self-tanner experience? More than one. Years ago, in London, someone rubbed me down with this green stuff, and when it came off I was still green. I was there for a press junket—I think it was for *Mean Girls*—and I had to scrub and scrub to get it off. **There are a lot of self-tanners out there.** **What makes yours different?** It's not tested on animals, it keeps skin hydrated, and the smell is really good. I was *obsessed* with making it smell good. **Your hair has gotten long. THE SCOOP

Shape Shifter?

WHAT IT IS: Nivea My Silhouette Redefining Gel-Cream.

WHAT IT CLAIMS: Tightens skin on the thighs, hips, waist, and stomach in four weeks to “redefine the appearance of the body’s contours to give your clothes a more flattering fit.”

WHAT’S IN IT: A “Bio-Slim complex” containing white tea (an antioxidant with caffeine) and anise extract (which is rich in peptides and proteins).

HOW IT WORKS: White tea expedites the breakdown of fat cells, while anise encourages collagen production to firm the skin and improve its texture, according to the company’s research.

WHAT AN EXPERT SAYS: “This is a great hydrator with good silicones and moisturizers,” says New York City dermatologist Doris Day. “It’s not going to get rid of every jiggle forever, but it may make your skin look and feel firmer while you’re using it.”

WHAT WE SAY: The bright green gel was lightweight and cooling, and it did seem to leave our thighs looking and feeling tighter. But even after four weeks, our skinny jeans were just as snug as they had been on day one.
